SPARTA SURVEY THE RESULTS ARE IN



The SPARTA survey closed at the end of June. Here are some highlights

We were very pleased that 176 people completed the SPARTA survey. Thank you to all of you that took the time to complete our survey. Your responses are very important in helping shape the future of SPARTA.

There was a good spread of respondents across all ranges including age groups. Of the 176 respondents only 42 were already SPARTA members. Unfortunately, nearly half of the people who completed the survey did not know that SPARTA ran two virtual activity weeks and only 32 of the respondents had taken part in the Virtual Activity Weeks.

Question 6 (see below) showed that there was interest in joining the current SPARTA clubs. We will be following this up further with those that showed interest.

The majority of people answering the survey were based in London (see right). It was nice to see responses across the UK as we are very interested in holding future SPARTA events outside of the London area.

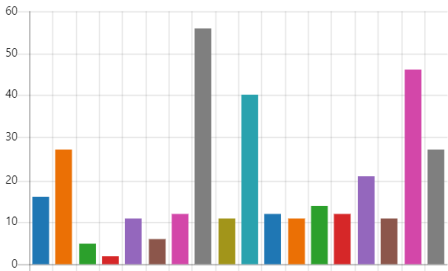
This is something that we are looking to do when restrictions are fully lifted, and we look forward to working with people across the country to offer more events

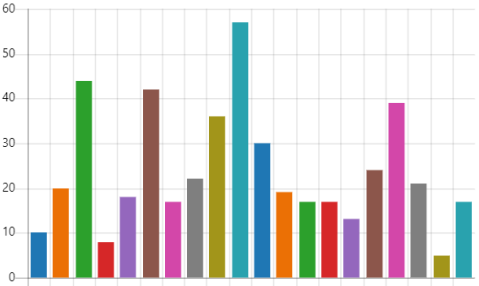

SPARTA LIFE

Stephen Hall, music director of the Civil Service Choir, talks about his and the choir's long involvement with SPARTA

I started work in the old 2 Marsham Street in the 1990s. I discovered that there was a choir, the Marsham Singers, which rehearsed on a lunchtime in the basement. I had sung at university and at school, so why not at work? I went down to the basement, was handed some music, joined the bass section, and hence joined DOETRA (now SPARTA). I have been a member of SPARTA ever since.

In the late 1990s the choir moved to Eland House in Victoria and was renamed the Victoria Singers. The choir struggled to retain membership and standards dropped. I became the chairman and, with the then two music directors, tried to keep it going - including collaborating with a similarly struggling Home Office choir, the Queen Anne Singers. We made the difficult decision to disband the choir in 2000.

From then on, the choir only had an intermittent existence to prepare and sing Christmas music for the staff carol service, which in later years I conducted.

In 2009, some colleagues and I decided the time was right to try to start a new choir which we called ETCetera - the Environment, Transport and Communities Choir. For the first rehearsal we only had 4 singers but by our inaugural concert a few months later we had grown to 25 singers. By 2019 membership had grown to 150 singers from across Whitehall - making it one of the largest workplace choirs in the country - and we were officially recognized

as the Civil Service Choir. We have given 134 performances large and small, including 41 public concerts. Through collections at concerts £39,500 has been raised for charities.

We have performed in Westminster Abbey (in a memorial service for Jeremy, Lord Heywood of Whitehall); in St John's Smith Square; in St Stephen's, Rochester Row; in the Guards' Chapel, Wellington Barracks; in St Martin-in-the-Fields, St Sepulchre-without-Newgate and St Katharine Cree as part of the Brandenburg London Choral Festival; in the London Jazz Festival; in Lancaster House; in Central Hall Westminster; in the Victoria and Albert Museum; and at events in various Government Departments in Westminster. We undertook our first tour in October 2018 during which we sang at the Menin Gate Last Post Ceremony in Ypres and gave a concert in Bruges, Belgium.

It remains to be seen whether the choir can return to anything like what it was following the Covid-19 pandemic. Changing work patterns will certainly make things more difficult. We have produced some virtual recordings in the meantime and on three occasions it has been possible to have a small group of singers performing together.

The support of SPARTA has been an integral part of the development and success of the Civil Service Choir and will be in getting the choir back singing and me conducting it post Covid-19.
